Train stations within walking distance of PMH

- West Leederville Station and City West Station (Perth - Fremantle line)

Free CAT Buses

Yellow CAT (stops opposite PMH)



- Monday to Friday 6:00am to 7:15pm
- Weekends and Public holidays 8:30am to 6:00pm
- Stop No 20 (to/from Perth city)

Green CAT



- Monday to Friday 6:00am to 7:00pm
- Stop No 7 (to/from Leederville Train Station)
- Stop No 15 (to/from Perth city and Esplanade Busport)

Red CAT



- Monday to Friday 6:00am to 7:15pm
- Weekends and Public holidays 8:30am to 6:00pm
- Stop No 17 (to/from Perth city)

Buses



- No 28 bus departs outside the PMH main entrance on Roberts Road for the city.
- No 28 bus from the city stops outside PMH on Hay St.



Going to the Airport



Bus

- No 40 bus between **Perth Domestic Airport and Perth City (Terminal 3 and 4)** and Perth City.
- No 380 bus between **Perth Airport (Terminal 1 and 2)** and Perth City.
- Monday to Sunday, approximately every 30 minutes, check timetables.
- Perth Airport Connect express shuttle between Perth Domestic Airport and Perth city, approximately every 50 minutes, fare starts at \$15 one way and \$25 return. Please visit www.perthairportconnect.com.au or call 1300 666 806.



Taxis



There are free taxi phones on level 4 by the central lifts, or in the exit near the Emergency Department.

Taxis are available for disabled passengers and it is recommended you book 24 hours in advance to avoid delays.

If you have a severe permanent disability you may be eligible to apply for the Taxi Users Subsidy Scheme (TUSS) for reduced fares. For further details email subsidies@transport.wa.gov.au or call 1300 660 147.
